Rev 13	Review: Roman Empire was conquered by German barbarians in 476 800 AD with the crowning of Charlemagne as the sixty- eighth emperor of Rome Martyrs during Catholicism 533-1793 AD (decree of Justinian to French Revolution)
Rev 14	Reuniting of two houses of Israel, see Ezekiel 37:15-23
Rev 15-16: The First Vial	1793-1815 Atheism, rejection of Roman Catholicism French Revolution
Rev 16: The Second Vial	Naval battles of France, Spain, and other Roman countries with Protestant British. Trafalgar (1805) The rise of the British Empire, rise of the missionary movement.
Rev 16: The Third Vial	Napoleonic Wars, stripping of the Vatican
Rev 16: The Fourth Vial	Napoleon and the fall of the Holy Roman Empire
Rev 16: The Fifth Vial	Wars for nationalism Papal States were absorbed into the new nation of Italy (1848-1870)
Rev 16: The Sixth Vial	Turkish empire defeated at the end of World War I in 1917. Return of Jews to Palestine and overview of 20 th century.
